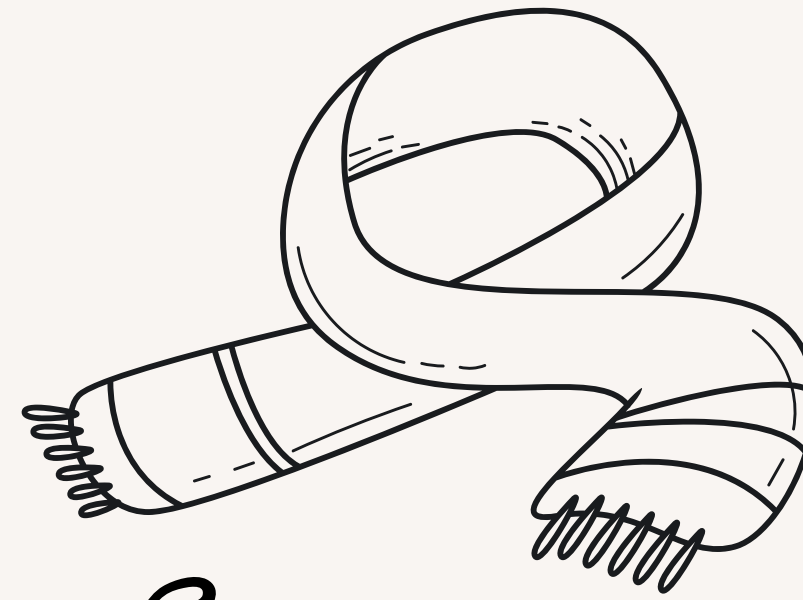


City of Gdansk - bootcamp location.

Gdańsk is one of the oldest and most historic cities in Poland. It was here that Solidarity was born, a movement that changed the course of Polish and European history. Gdańsk combines the unique atmosphere of a port city, which for centuries witnessed important historical events. In January, it is worth preparing for the cold winter weather - the average temperature is between -15°C and $+5^{\circ}\text{C}$, so warm clothes are a must. Three places to see:

1. **Amber Museum** - This is the only museum of its kind in Poland, where you can see a unique collection of amber, which is a symbol of Gdańsk. It is the perfect place to learn about the history and diversity of this natural treasure.
2. **The Main Town** - Charming streets, historic houses and the impressive St Mary's Basilica. Strolling along Długi Targ, you will feel the history of this port city, which has witnessed many landmark events. In the centre of Gdańsk there are many historic churches, monuments and museums that can be visited.
3. **Gdańsk Crane** - One of the city's icons, which for centuries served as a harbour crane. Today, it is a symbol of trade and shipping in Gdansk, and from its height you can enjoy a picturesque view of the Motława River and the Old Town.

Must to take to Gdansk:

- Warm winter jacket.
- Hat, scarf and gloves.
- Jumpers or sweatshirts - preferably several layers.
- Outdoor/Winter boots with good grip (for snow/rain)



In Poland, the currency is the Polish złoty (PLN). Euros can be exchanged for złotys at the airport exchange office, some ATMs, or at exchange offices in the city center. 1 Euro is approximately 4.2 PLN.



Transfer from the airport to the hotel.

1. After leaving the terminal of Lech Walesa Airport in Gdansk, go to the bus stop “**Port lotniczy 01**”, located opposite the passenger terminal, next to car park P1.
2. At the bus stop you will find a ticket machine where you can purchase a ticket for your journey. The price of a single-trip ticket is PLN 4.80 (normal) and PLN 2.40 (reduced).
3. Take bus line **210**, running in the direction “**Dworzec PKP Gdańsk Główny**”.
4. After about 35-40 minutes of driving you will arrive at the “**Dworzec PKP Gdańsk Główny**” bus stop. Once you get off the bus, head towards the underpass to the other side of the street, which is located near the bus stop.
5. At the end of the underpass, turn right. Once at street level, turn left and walk straight along this street, passing, among others, the Madison Shopping Centre on your left. After walking a few hundred metres you will see Hotel Ibis Gdańsk Stare Miasto on your right hand side, at number 24.

You can also order a taxi (via the Uber or Bolt app) - for a transfer from the airport to the hotel you will pay about 100 PLN, which is about 24 EUR.

Route from the hotel to the training venue at 11 Głęboka Street.

1. Leave the hotel via the main exit onto Jana Heweliusza Street. Turn left and walk along Jana Heweliusza street for about 5 minutes until you reach the tram stop 'Dworzec Główny'. To get to the tram stop, take the same underpass you took to get to the hotel.
2. At the '**Dworzec Główny**' stop, buy a public transport ticket (normal PLN 4.80, reduced PLN 2.40 - available from the ticket machine at the stop or via the mobile app). Take tram no. 8 or 9 in the direction of 'Stogi Plaza'. Get off at the 'Głęboka' stop. The tram journey will take approximately 10 minutes.
3. After exiting the tram, head in the direction of Głęboka Street. The building of School Complex No. 6 is located at 11 Głęboka Street.
